Nebraska CASA Facts

- 788 Nebraskans volunteered as advocates in 2024.
- 1,936 Nebraska children had a CASA volunteer in 2024.
- Volunteers donated 31,019 hours of their time and traveled 235,202 miles in 2024.
- 6,098 child visits were conducted by volunteers in 2024.
- 1,300 Nebraska children are without a volunteer advocate.
- 22 local CASA programs serve 55 counties in the State.
- CASA programs have served Nebraska children for 38 years.





Facts about CASA

CASA stands for Court Appointed Special Advocate

Court Appointed Special Advocates are volunteers who are appointed by judges to speak in court for the safety and well-being of an abused or neglected child.

Who we are

CASA volunteers come from all walks of life. More than half of CASA volunteers are employed full time. CASA volunteers are well-trained and supported by competent and professional staff.

What we do

CASA volunteers spend time with children and those involved in their case. They provide reports to the judge on the best interest of the child.

Why we do it

Children with a CASA volunteer receive more services, spend less time in foster care, have better outcomes in school. They know there is one caring adult dedicated to them simply because they care.

Our Impact

Support

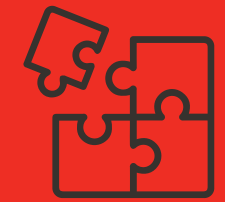
Judges, attorneys, child protective workers and parents overwhelmingly report that CASA volunteers make a difference in the lives of the children they serve.

Assistance

Children with a CASA volunteer are half as likely to spend time in long-term foster care, defined as more than three years in care. Also, cases involving a CASA volunteer are more likely to stay permanently closed.

Influence

Fewer than 10% of children with a CASA volunteer re-enter the foster care system.



CASA Best Interest Advocacy

CASA Volunteers advocate for the best interests of children who have experienced abuse or neglect

Learn and Engage

CASA volunteers learn all they can about the child and his or her family life. They then engage with the child during regular visits.

Collaborate

CASA volunteers collaborate with others to ensure that necessary services are provided and are in the child's best interest.

BEST INTEREST ADVOCACY

Recommend

CASA volunteers speak up for the child's best interests in court. They make recommendations regarding the child's placement and needed services.

Report

CASA Volunteers report what they have observed and learned in court. At the same time, they monitor the child's situation until their case is released by the court.

NEBRASKA CASA FINANCIAL IMPACT



Return on Investment

For **every \$1 invested** in Nebraska CASA, **\$6 are returned** to the state of Nebraska. The average cost of a CASA volunteer is \$3,018, and total benefits they provide are \$18,122.



Investment Impact – Taxpayers

Per child, Nebraska CASA indirectly saves taxpayers **\$13,898** in reduced administrative costs and reduced costs to the public.



Investment Impact – Beneficiaries

Per child, Nebraska CASA assists direct beneficiaries by **\$4,224** by assisting children with improved health and increased safety, along with impacts on the child's future earnings.

- Legislative representation at the State and Federal level
- Strengthening relationships with the Nebraska Judiciary Branch
- Providing informational conferences to assist with sharing our message
- Foster and expand critical relationships for CASA programming

Nebraska CASA will assist local programs to help in building their capacity to serve more children and youth

- Recruitment and retention of volunteers
- Providing assistance to local programs looking to expand their footprint
- Facilitating collaboration between large and small local programs
- Evaluating and exploring new training needs to local programs
- Offering support services to board members of local programs and ensuring their support

Nebraska CASA will continuously review internal organizational structure to ensure the organization is able to serve the needs of constituents

- Foster reviews of staff capacities, job descriptions and salaries to assist with expanding programming
- Identifying and sharing of best practices and efficiencies across the state
- Developing a communication plan to assist with language access for all children and youth
- Undergo technology and process reviews to ensure the association is meeting the needs of local programs
- Ensuring the association stays culturally and linguistically diverse through networking and advocacy efforts

Strategic Plan Area of Focus 2 - Increase Revenues to ensure Nebraska CASA can continue to progress

- Focus on ways for individuals to donate to CASA

Nebraska CASA will enhance marketing and messaging strategies and tools to help grow support for our mission

- Finding new and unique ways to share our narrative
- Networking with key groups who can assist in growing the association
- Cultivating new funding sources through marketing and messaging efforts
- Identifying other opportunities to leverage assistance, like volunteer groups

Nebraska CASA will look to raise funding to support new positions and initiatives

- Review organizational structure to ensure work is being assigned in a manner that helps the association continue to grow
- Defining roles and responsibilities of staff to help make sure staff feel informed and empowered in their role
- Review the budget to confirm association financials
- Identify tasks that can be offloaded from current staff and handled by new positions, either as new full time staff or part time assistance
